





From a high-tech stadium that hosts the top names in sports and music to beloved amusement and water parks, Arlington doesn't disappoint the thousands of families that flock to this year-round vacation spot.

SOAK UP SIX FLAGS OVER TEXAS

You can easily spend an entire weekend at Six Flags Over Texas, the first theme park to call the region home. From its range of rides to its seasonal events like Holiday in the Park, Six Flags caters to families and groups. Daredevils will love the park's smorgasbord of thrill rides like the New Texas Giant, a hybrid roller coaster that marries traditional wooden-coaster architecture with high-tech steel aerodynamics, while the youngsters-and those with tamer tastes—will appreciate the Silver Star Carousel and Texas Tea Cups.

Fans of the park's Gotham City attractions will thrill to three new rides for 2016. The Riddler's Revenge features a swinging pendulum that lifts guests nearly 150 feet off the ground, the Catwoman's Whip spins and tilts riders in a dizzying circle and Harley Quinn Spinsanity offers swirling family fun. Live entertainment, a variety of dining options and countless shopping opportunities round out Six Flags' impressive list of nonstop diversions.

LOCAL'S TIP: IF YOU PLAN TO SPEND A LOT OF TIME AT SIX FLAGS OR HOPE TO VISIT MULTIPLE TIMES THROUGHOUT THE YEAR, PURCHASE A SEASON PASS. PASSES INCLUDE SPECIAL HOLIDAY PROMOTION OFFERS AND DISCOUNTS TO BRING A FRIEND FREE, AMONG OTHER BENEFITS. CONSIDER BUYING A PASS IN DECEMBER, WHEN THE PARK TYPICALLY OFFERS ADDITIONAL HOLIDAY PERKS LIKE UPGRADES AND FREE PARKING.

PLAY BALL

If you're traveling to Arlington between April and September, plan your stay around a Texas Rangers game at Globe Life Park, home to the American League team since 1994. Here, the whole family can indulge in a single Boomstick, an impressive, two-foot long hot dog that weighs nearly a pound—but

don't forget to save room for nachos. And be sure to leave room in your itinerary for a behind-thescenes tour of the stadium.

Arlington's AT&T Stadium may be best known as the home of the Dallas Cowboys, but this stateof-the art complex also features concerts by internationally known performers like the Rolling Stones and Kenny Chesney, rodeo and wrestling smackdowns and intense match-ups for soccer rivals and basketball teams from around the globe. Single-admission tickets may be available for some events; check in advance of your visit. Touring the \$1.3 billion stadium itself is worth your time (we especially like the Art Tour, described on page 36), and it's another way to get inside the impressive facility even if a football game or concert isn't on your itinerary.

ROCK 'N' BOWL

Across the street from Six Flags, a giant bowling pin welcomes visitors to a campus devoted to the past, present and future of bowling. The International Bowling Museum & Hall of Fame features interactive exhibits and tributes to bowling greats like Don Carter and Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, as well as Bowlopolis, a hands-on activity that teaches the basics of bowling.

Put those skills to the test at Alley Cats Entertainment, offering non-stop family fun 365 days a year. With 40,000 square feet of indoor space and a full-service restaurant and bar, Alley Cats doesn't fool around when it comes to a good time. Set up a friendly wager on the neon-splashed bowling lanes or sharpen your skills at one of Alley Cats' billiard tables. Go toe-to-toe in a laser tag shootout in the complex's two-story arena, or challenge yourself on the 26-foot-high rock-climbing wall.

The Alley Cats arcade features games from old-school Skee ball to the latest video games where players win tickets for awesome, even seasonal prizes, like camping tents in the summertime. A few games reward lucky winners on the spot with iPads and other cool merchandise.

Let the fun continue next door at Putt-Putt Golf & Games, with 54 holes of miniature golf on a beautifully landscaped course, mini bowling, more arcade games and batting cages.

EXPLORE THE PARK

Build in outdoor family time with a paddling excursion on the Trinity River at 1,300-acre River Legacy Parks. Rent a canoe from







ters and enjoy a leisurely float with panoramic views. Spend the day navigating the Trinity River Paddling Trail's entire eight miles or sample the shorter, two-mile route. Seasoned and first-time anglers will appreciate the river's abundant stock of sunfish, largemouth bass and catfish. However you customize your paddling adventure, keep an eye out for great blue herons and snowy egrets, eastern fox squirrels and bobcats. Elms, oaks and a variety of other flora dot the Trinity's banks.

Learn more about the area by visiting River Legacy Living Science Center, the interactive nature center housed in a 12,000-square-foot, sustainably designed building. Hands-on exhibits, aquariums and terrariums educate in a way that's fun and entertaining for all ages. Walk the nature trails and cap off your visit with a stop at Acorn Gift Shop.

CONQUER CLIMBING

If the weather's not cooperating, take the fun indoors. With more than 16,000 square feet of climbing surface, Dyno-Rock Indoor Climbing Center can accommodate all comers, from the climbing newbie to the experienced pro eager to tackle bouldering routes and top climbing. All guests are required to take a 10-minute safety class, and equipment is available for climbers as young as two years old. Dyno-Rock's one-day pass lets guests come and go, allowing you to take a break to fit in other sightseeing options between climbs.

MAKE A SPLASH

Beat the summer heat between May and September at Six Flags Hurricane Harbor, Six Flags' water-themed amusement park. Stoke some friendly family competition on Wahoo Racer, one of the park's thrill rides. With six lanes and two tiers, this water slide is the largest of its kind in the world. Take off from a launching pad that's nearly 60 feet off the ground, then rocket head first on specially designed water toboggans that'll have you flying at speeds up to 40 miles per hour.

Surf Lagoon, Hurricane Harbor's surfing simulator and wave pool. Paddle around in Boogie Beach's enormous wading pool or head over to Hook's Lagoon Treehouse, where the kids can climb and splash while you kick back in the lounging area. Have little ones? Hang out at Hook's Ship, whose small slides, sprayers and shallow water work best for the park's youngest guests. Finally, enjoy a snack or a meal at Beachside Grill while you listen to live bands or a DJ spinning the latest tracks.

COOL DOWN

No matter what time of year you visit Arlington, take advantage of ICE at The Parks, a regulation NHL-sized ice skating rink conveniently located in Arlington's largest shopping mall. Sharpen your skating skills, join a hockey game

or take in a seasonal skating show. And with an 18-screen movie theater and a variety of retail stores, The Parks at Arlington has something for every family member.



NAMESAKE LAKE

ring along your love for all things water, because Lake Arlington provides more than 2,000 acres of fun. Kayaks and canoes are available for rent, with beginner classes available every Saturday and Sunday at the south end of the lake.

Bowman Springs and Richard Simpson parks offer boat ramps, and lakefront rental facilities provide catfish and bass fishing excursions. If you find yourself in Arlington on April 9, check out the Arlington Bass Classic competition. Many of the region's top fishermen will compete to win big prize money.

"Arlington is one of the great outdoor cities in Texas," says Gary Packan, assistant director of the Arlington Parks and Recreation Department. "Visitors don't realize all there is to do."

course attracts players from all over the country. The Arlington Disc Golf Association maintains the course's varying topography and challenges,

from hilly and steep terrain to woody areas and open fields. Veterans Park also boasts a 1.4-mile walking trail, a fishing pond and a beautiful wildscape garden that's home to native Texas plants.

River Legacy Parks, Arlington's largest, are home to 10 miles of trails that are favorites of local runners and mountain bikers. The parks feature exercise stations, hard- and soft-surface nature trails, a naturethemed playground, pavilions and the Trinity River Paddling Trail.

In the heart of Arlington's Entertainment District lies Richard Greene Linear Park. The outdoor space is home to the acclaimed five-piece Caelum Moor



sculpture. As many as 25 works of art will eventually line the trail. The soon-to-be-displayed Unity Arch, a commissioned stainless steel sculpture, will feature decorative lighting and landscaping. Walk, run or rollerblade the art-inspired trail that offers the feel of nature in the shadows of two of the Lone Star State's most celebrated sports stadiums.

Skateboarding continues to grow as a popular activity in Arlington, and Vandergriff Park's skate park is a big reason why. Located in central Arlington just north of Interstate-20, its transitional and plaza skating terrain is designed for all ages and skill levels. Take in the sun and channel your inner Tony Hawk here or at one of Arlington's other skate parks that offer terrain for everyone.

A TASTE OF THE PRESERVE

Bowman Springs Road leads to the celebrated Southwest Nature Preserve, 58 acres of undeveloped land featuring fishing ponds and soft-surface trails to explore and enjoy. A serene place to see native plants and wildlife, this spot will keep an avid birdwatcher busy. Step onto the high bluff, and on a clear day, you can see all the way to Fort Worth.

GFT IN THE GAME

For those who prefer their golf disc-free, Tierra Verde Golf Club has been ranked No. 1 for DFW municipal golf courses and achieved Audubon Signature Sanctuary

certification. Enjoy playing this golf course with a secluded feel, so much that you might not see anyone playing anywhere around you, as if you reserved your own private links for the day. Of course, you might spy a roadrunner or a bobcat, both known to get perturbed if you don't allow them to play through.

Waterchase Golf Club is an immaculately kept par-72 course that combines challenge and beauty. It made Golf Digest's list of Best New Courses in 2001 and remains a Metroplex favorite.

TENNIS ANYONE?

The Arlington Tennis Center is a nationally known tennis facility that hosts local, regional and national tournaments. Even the famed U.S. Open National Playoffs have a sectional qualifying tournament here, where amateurs and pros alike can vie for a chance to play in the U.S. Open. With Arlington's stadiums in the distance, it's a scenic and fitting farewell to the weekend. *






FAME AND FORTUNE

ne of Arlington's most scenic and tranquil spots was once a place of great glamour and controversy. Today, Top O' Hill Terrace is part of Arlington Baptist College, but in the 1930s and 1940s, this former tea room fronted an illegal speakeasy and gambling joint.

Bugsy Malone, Howard Hughes and top stars like Clark Gable frequented the popular casino, located beneath the charming and very proper tea room and gardens. VIPs had to wind their way through a series of hallways and checkpoints to reach the basement speakeasy, which even had escape tunnels to help famous patrons escape during occasional raids.

Baptist pastor J. Frank Norris considered the casino a scourge on the town and vowed one day to own it. His dream came true in the mid 1950s, when he purchased the property and turned it into a seminary that eventually became the college. Some 60 years later, Top O' Hill Terrace's elaborate stone walls, archways and wrought iron gates welcome visitors for tours throughout the year. Secret passageways and artifacts from Top O' Hill's heyday are still being discovered. Visitors can ogle original poker chips, holstered pistols and even a few fashion accessories possibly left behind in haste as guests fled the law. Tours are available.







PERFECT HARMONY

Historic Arlington Music Hall is home to Symphony Arlington and a who's who of talented regional, national and international performers led by musical director Robert Carter Austin. Guest soloists for 2016 include Iranian pianist Sara Daneshpour, Bulgarian cellist Kalin Ivanov and American pianist Stephen Beus. The symphony's season, October through May, takes place in a former movie palace that has hosted live events for more than 60 years. Today, the renovated theater boasts a top-of-the-line sound and lighting system and just over 1,000 seats. Experience all of Arlington Music Hall's musical offerings with the entire family.

SUMMER NIGHTS

Enjoy a more laid-back musical experience at Levitt Pavilion for the Performing Arts, Downtown Arlington's popular open-air amphitheater. Frequently described as one of Arlington's hidden jewels, Levitt Pavilion hosts more than 50 free concerts annually beginning in early summer and running through October. Past seasons have included acts like Kenny Loggins, Grammy winner Brave Combo and The Doobie Brothers. The pavilion is a perfect spot for a picnic dinner under the stars—bring your own feast or make a menu selection from the many popular on-site vendors. Then kick back on a blanket or lounge in a lawn chair for the ultimate easy-listening experience.
